

Visual Arts Faculty Position 2019-2020:

Marianapolis Preparatory School seeks a qualified visual arts teacher, preferably with three to five years experience in an independent secondary school setting. The teaching position will include teaching five classes and acting as the faculty advisor to the Visual Arts and Literary Journal, working with the collaboration and supervision of the Visual Arts Department Chair and the Academic Dean. Marianapolis seeks a dedicated and accomplished art teacher who will encourage students to develop their aesthetic understanding and appreciation while simultaneously developing their artistic skills and talents. The qualified applicant should have experience teaching high school level visual arts – with significant background and experience in photography – and the ability to teach at all levels. Preference is given to candidates with knowledge and experience in using educational technology in visual arts teaching.

Preference will be given to candidates who can:

- Demonstrate skills in oral and written communication
- Teach students to apply elements of design and modern principles of art
- Assist students with effective display and presentation of their works
- Assist in planning, coordinating, and preparing art displays and exhibitions for the school and community, as well as for competitions
- Instruct students in the proper use, storage, and maintenance of materials, equipment, and tools
- Demonstrate a desire to work with high school learners
- Manage multi-faceted work in an intense and supportive learning community

All teacher candidates are expected to have either experience or interest in learning the Understanding by Design curriculum development framework and to attend a new faculty workshop in August. Preferred candidates must enjoy working with adolescents, have an ability to work well in a student-centered curriculum, and understand student learning styles and differentiated instruction.

In addition, the position includes: advising, participation as an athletic coach or activities leader for two seasons each year, and involvement in residential life – understanding that the typical commitment involves both after school activities and weeknight-weekend supervision.
